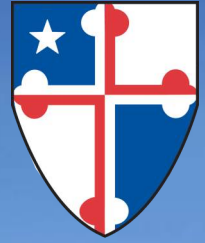

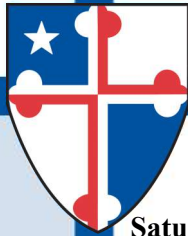

Parroquia del Sagrado Corazón

Domingo De Ramos De La Pasión Del Señor

14 De Abril De 2019

El Domingo de Ramos, con sus palmas, procesiones y lecturas, es uno de los días especiales que pueden evocar fuertes conexiones emocionales en nuestra historia espiritual, para aquellos que han estado en la iglesia la mayor parte de sus vidas. Para aquellos que son nuevos en el catolicismo y el cristianismo, sospecho que todavía tiene un impacto debido a su singularidad.

El relato evangélico de la entrada triunfante de Jesús en el pueblo, en medio de hosannas y palmeras, no nos permite reflexionar mucho sobre la admiración y aprobación que la gente tenía por él. En sintonía con la réplica de Jesús de que "incluso las piedras gritarán", sería bueno disfrutar del momento por un momento; sería agradable atreverse a pensar qué tan satisfactoria y gratificante debe haber sido esa tarde, y qué tan bien merecida. Pero, casi de inmediato, nos llevan más allá de esa escena al resto de lo que trata la Semana Santa: la seriedad de la Última Cena, los juicios, las traiciones, la tortura y la muerte.

Mientras que algunas de las palmeras probablemente no eran verdaderos discípulos, al menos algunos de los que estaban tan emocionados deben haber sido legítimamente movidos por Jesús y su poder y su amor.

La tradición dice que algunas de las mismas personas probablemente estuvieron en la multitud unos días después, gritando "¡Crucificalo!" A Poncio Pilato. A menudo nos sentimos más santos que tú y nos preguntamos cómo podrían haber sido tan inconstantes, tan fácilmente influidos, tan desarraigados en su profundidad

espiritual. Pero también sabemos cómo damos la espalda a los buenos y a los justos cuando no tenemos todos los hechos, e incluso a veces cuando los tenemos.

La lección en los días previos a la celebración del Domingo de Ramos, incluido este curso, será prolongar un poco más las palmeras. Para sentir su entusiasmo, su entusiasmo por Jesús y su mensaje. Para reflexionar sobre sus obras milagrosas y su amor profundo. Y orar para que la realidad de la alegría que viene de adorarle permanezca en los tiempos oscuros hasta que se levante la Pascua.

Jueves Santo

Damos inicio al triduo pascual, con la Santa Misa, en donde conmemoramos la última cena, en la cual se instituyó la Eucaristía y el Orden Sacerdotal.

Esta celebración será Bilingüe en el Templo principal, iniciando a las 7:30 pm.

Santo Viacrucis meditado por el grupo de Jóvenes "Esperanza Latina" donde recordamos la pasión y muerte de Nuestro Señor Jesucristo. Se realizará en los alrededores de la parroquia. Iniciará a las 5:00pm, en los jardines parroquiales.

Celebración de los santos oficios, en el gimnasio (al finalizar el viacrucis)

Sábado Santo

Vayamos todos juntos como Iglesia a entonar el ¡Gloria! y a glorificar el nombre de Nuestro Señor Jesús, porque él ha vencido la muerte. Esta celebración eucarística será bilingüe, en el Templo principal a las 7:30pm.

Sacramental

Bautizos: Se celebran cada segundo sábado del mes (excepto durante la cuaresma). Los padres y los padrinos requieren asistir a una clase de preparación que se realiza el tercer domingo de cada mes y los padrinos deben haber recibido todos los sacramentos de iniciación cristiana (Bautizo, Confirmación y Eucaristía). 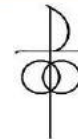

Lenten Disciplines – Good Friday

Good Friday is a day of Fast and Abstinence from meat; meals are limited to a single full meal and two lighter meals. All persons 14 years and older are bound by the law of abstinence. The law of fast binds all adults until the age of 60. Fasting and prayer purifies and clarifies; it disposes us to enter more fully into the saving mysteries of Christ's Passion, Death, and Resurrection.

Is God Calling YOU to the Diaconate?

The diaconate has been a wonderful blessing to the Church. This past year, the Church has celebrated 50 years since the full restoration, and our parishes and communities have been blessed by the ministry of deacons. The deacon's identity reminds us of the importance of the Church's ministry to the poor, the neglected, and the marginalized. We are being called to find those people who need our love, our mercy, and our support. If you are willing to

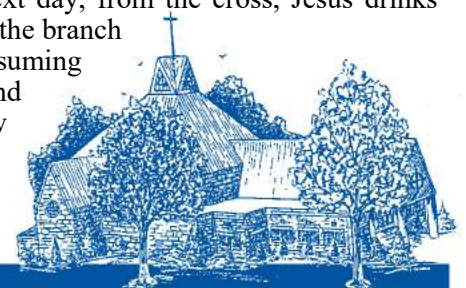
consider a vocation to the diaconate (or if you would like to encourage another by passing along this information), the formation team of the Archdiocese will host two information sessions in which you and your wife may learn about the formation process as well as diaconal ministry. The Archdiocese begins formation every other year and will start the Class of 2023 this September. The formation sessions will be **Tuesday, April 23** at 7:30 PM at St. Ignatius, Ijamsville (4103 Prices Distillery Rd.) and **Saturday, April 27** at 10:00 AM at the Catholic Community of South Baltimore, Holy Cross Hall (110 E. Catholic Scripture Study: Discovering the Mass in the Bible
In preparation for the Feast of the ancient Passover, lambs were sacrificed in the Temple only by the priests, who also collected the blood of the lambs in gold and silver basins and poured it out on the altar of atonement. These Passover lambs were then prepared for roasting and eating — one spit was transfixed from the lower body up to the head, and one spit was fixed across the back, to which were attached the limbs.

Ancient sources describe the Passover meal as being structured around 4 cups of wine: the Cup of Sanctification, the Cup of Proclamation, the Cup of Blessing, and the Cup of Praise. Rabbinic sources specify that traditionally, the Cup of Praise was consumed after the singing of the Hymn of Praise from Psalms 113-118.

While the Jewish Passover looked back at what God did at the time of the Exodus, at the Last Supper Jesus looks ahead to his death, resurrection, and the New Covenant Eucharist he is about to inaugurate. Instead of using the meat of the lamb and the traditional words of Passover, Jesus elevates the unleavened bread and says, *"This is my Body which is given for you."* Thus he identifies himself as the New Passover Lamb, the priestly sacrifice of which he commands the Apostles to repeat — *"Do this in remembrance of me."* Jesus then takes the Cup of Blessing, saying, *"This chalice which is poured out for you is the New Covenant in my Blood."* (1 Cor 10:16) Jesus and the Apostles then sing the Hymn of Praise while walking from the Upper Room to the Mount of Olives, but the last cup has yet to be consumed. The next day, from the cross, Jesus drinks the sour wine from the branch of hyssop, thus consuming the Cup of Praise and completing the New Covenant Passover with these words:

"It is finished."
