





Domingo de la Ascensión del Señor

Solemnidad de Pentecostés

Los discípulos en este momento quedan constituídos en testimonios veraces y valientes de la Pascua del Señor, anunciadores de su misterio y de la nueva ley del amor, proclamada por Cristo en su Evangelio de salvación. Llega así el cumplimiento de la Pascua del Señor: los frutos de la redención por medio de la muerte y resurrección de Cristo se concretan en la efusión del Espíritu Santo. Esta es la razón por la que San Juan coloca el día de Pentecostés con el día de la Resurrección. Apareciendo a los discípulos reunidos en el Cenáculo, les muestra los signos de su crucifixión, Jesús sopló sobre ellos y dijo "Recibid al Espíritu Santo. A los que les perdonen los pecados, les quedarán perdonados; y a los que no se les perdonen, les quedarán sin perdonar". Este soplo simboliza y concreta el don del Espíritu Santo, principio omnipotente de la nueva creación operada por la muerte y resurrección de Cristo. Así que el Nuevo Pueblo mediante la Sangre de Cristo, sanciona la Nueva y eterna alianza.

Con Pentecostés se realiza una nueva creación, la del Cuerpo Místico de Cristo. Todos sus miembros son unificados por el Espíritu de Dios. En efecto, siguiendo a San Agustín podemos recordar la siguiente analogía: "Aquello que nuestro espíritu, es decir nuestra alma, es en relación a nuestros miembros, lo es el Espíritu Santo para los miembros de Cristo, es decir para el Cuerpo de Cristo que es la Iglesia". (Sermón 269, 2: PL 38,1232). ¿En qué sentido la aplicamos?

El Espíritu Santo es el principio vital de la Iglesia. Es el dador de vida y de unidad

de la Iglesia. Es autor y promotor de la vida divina del Cuerpo de Cristo. Es el soplo vital de la nueva creación que se concreta en la Iglesia. Siendo vida divina significa que santifica continuamente a la Iglesia. La santidad será la identidad profunda de la Iglesia como Cuerpo de Cristo, vivificado y partícipe de su Espíritu.

También será alma de la Iglesia en el sentido de inspirar la luz divina en el pensamiento de la Iglesia. Asiste al Magisterio siendo el espíritu de verdad, prometido por Cristo en la última Cena. Todo el anuncio de la verdad revelada es inspirado por Él y obra la profundización y experiencia de fe a todos los niveles del Cuerpo de Cristo: tanto en el Magisterio como en el *sensus fidei* de todos los creyentes: catequistas, teólogos, pensadores.



«Id al mundo entero y proclamad el Evangelio a toda la creación. El que crea y se bautice se salvará; el que se resista a creer será condenado. A los que crean, les acompañarán estos signos: echarán demonios en mi nombre, hablarán lenguas nuevas, cogerán serpientes en sus manos y, si beben un veneno mortal, no les hará daño. Impondrán las manos a los enfermos, y quedarán sanos.»

Sacramental

Bautizos: Se celebran cada segundo sábado del mes (excepto durante la cuaresma). Los padres y los padrinos requieren asistir a una clase de preparación que se realiza el tercer domingo de cada mes y los padrinos deben haber recibido todos los sacramentos de iniciación cristiana (Bautizo, Confirmación y Eucaristía). Favor llamar a la oficina para mayor información.

Matrimonio: Las parejas que están planeando en casarse deben contactar al sacerdote o el diacono por lo menos seis meses antes de la fecha planeada para este sacramento. Todas las parejas comprometidas deben de tomar el cursillo prematrimonial.

Unción de los Enfermos: En caso de emergencia llamar a la oficina parroquial o a la rectoría. Por favor notificar a la oficina si sabe de alguien que se encuentre en el hospital y necesite de este sacramento.

Sacramento de la Reconciliación: El sacramento de la confesión se celebra los sábados de 5:30 pm a 6:45 pm

New Marian Feast Day Declared

Pope Francis has decreed a new Feast Day to the Universal Calendar. The Latin-Rite Catholics around the world will mark the feast of the Blessed Virgin Mary, "**Mother of the Church**" on the Monday after Pentecost each year. The decree announcing the addition to the church calendar was released March 3 by the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Sacraments. This year the feast will be celebrated on **Monday, May 21**. Honoring Mary as mother of the Church on the day after Pentecost highlights for Catholics that Mary was present with the disciples on Pentecost, praying with them as the Holy Spirit descended.

During this time he will also receive antibodies from his mother, protecting him from a wide variety of diseases. 
