

**Scripture Readings: August 12, 2018**


1 Kgs 19:4-8 • Ps 34:2-9

## Nuestro destino es vivir como amigos de Jesús

“Nosotros hemos recibido este don como destino, la amistad del Señor. Ésta es nuestra vocación: vivir siendo amigos del Señor, amigos del Señor. Y lo mismo habían recibido los Apóstoles, de modo más fuerte aún, pero lo mismo. Todos nosotros, los cristianos, hemos recibido este don: la apertura, el acceso al corazón de Jesús, a la amistad de Jesús. Hemos recibido en suerte el don de tu amistad. Nuestro destino es ser amigos tuyos. Es un don que el Señor conserva siempre y Él es fiel a este don”.

## Jesús no reniega su amistad, ni siquiera con quien traiciona

Pero muchas veces nosotros no lo somos y nos alejamos “con nuestros pecados, con nuestros caprichos”, pero “Él es fiel a la amistad”. Por lo tanto, Jesús, tal como lo recuerda el Evangelio del día (Jn 15,9-17), ya no nos llama “siervos” sino “amigos” y conserva esta palabra hasta el fin, porque es fiel. Incluso con Judas: la última palabra que le dirige, antes de la traición, es “amigo”. No le dice “vete”:


“Jesús es nuestro amigo. Y Judas, como dice aquí, ha ido por su suerte nueva, por su destino que él ha elegido libremente, se ha alejado de Jesús. Y la apostasía es esto: alejarse de Jesús. Un amigo que se convierte en enemigo o un amigo que se vuelve indiferente o un amigo que llega a ser traidor”.

## Permanecer en la amistad con Jesús, recibida en don

Por tanto, en lugar de Judas – tal como narra la Primera Lectura (Hch 1, 15-17.20-26) – es elegido en suerte Matías “por ser testigo de la Resurrección”, “testigo de este don de amor”. “Amigo – recordó el Papa Francisco – es aquel que comparte precisamente los secretos” con el otro. “Los he llamado amigos porque todo lo que he oído de mi Padre se lo he dado a conocer a ustedes”, dice, en efecto, Jesús en el Evangelio. Se trata, por lo tanto, de una amistad que “hemos recibido en suerte, es decir, como destino”, como lo habían recibido Judas y Matías:

“Pensemos en esto, Él no reniega este don, no nos reniega, nos espera hasta el final. Y cuando nosotros, por nuestra debilidad, nos alejamos de Él, Él espera, Él espera, Él sigue diciendo: “Amigo, te espero. Amigo ¿qué quieres? Amigo, ¿por qué con un beso me traicionas?”. Él es fiel en la amistad y nosotros debemos pedirle esta gracia de permanecer en su amor, permanecer en su amistad, esa amistad que nosotros hemos recibido como don, en suerte, de Él”.



**Answers:**

1. We each have a guardian angel. No matter if you are a Christian or not, you are assigned a guardian angel at the moment of your conception to help lead you towards God’s salvation.
2. While there is some debate about when exactly angels were created, we know for sure that angels came before humans and most likely before the earth as well.
3. Since angels do not have physical bodies (Hebrews 1:14), they cannot be hurt in the sense of suffering physical harm in the same way a human being with a body could be hurt.
4. The angels are ordered into nine “choirs” and are ranked according to their natural intelligence – far above human intelligence.



#### Do you know when children prepare for the sacraments?

Children in the parish are prepared for the sacraments of reconciliation and Eucharist during the 2<sup>nd</sup> grade year of their faith formation program (religious education classes or Catholic school). Children must attend a program in both 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> grade in order to be fully ready to receive these sacraments. This is a special time for children and their families, bringing much excitement as they learn their prayers and become spiritually aware! A separate program, called RCIC, is available for children in grade 3 or higher with no previous faith formation who have not yet celebrated these sacraments or who perhaps have not yet been baptized. Parents have an important role in this process, since much of the preparation is done at home with their children.
