

## La naturaleza de la fe

Nuestra alma tiene la admirable capacidad de sentir a Dios. Este sentimiento de Dios a veces es claramente perceptible, pero inmaduro en la juventud. Si se lo desarrolla espiritualmente de una manera correcta, se fortalece en el hombre y se alcanza la fe consciente es decir, se adquiere la certeza de que existe un único Dios, Creador del Universo, que se preocupa de las personas y de toda la naturaleza.

Si la fe en el hombre está viva y sana, entonces ella no se limita a un frío reconocimiento de que Dios existe, sino que se expresa en el deseo de comunicarse con Él. El alma creyente busca a Dios de una manera natural, como las plantas buscan el Sol. A su vez, la comunicación viva con Dios fortalece aun más en el hombre la fe, así que la fe se convierte en la dirección espiritual basada en la experiencia personal. En algunas personas, especialmente llenas de gracia, la fe se convierte en una idea inspiradora y portadora de luz, que los lleva de este mundo agitado y de pecado al montañoso mundo de la verdad perpetua. Entre estas personas están los santos: Sergio de Radonezh y Serafín de Sarov, Juan de Kronstadt, Germán de Alaska y otros

como ellos.

La importancia de la fe en el desarrollo del hombre consiste en que ella le da la dirección necesaria a todas sus fuerzas espirituales, a su inteligencia, a sus sentimientos y a su voluntad, y también lleva armonía a su mundo interior. Así, por ejemplo, a la inteligencia le da claridad y una correcta concepción del mundo; a la voluntad, le da un punto de apoyo y un objetivo; a los sentimientos, los ennoblece y los limpia. La fe aparta al hombre de los bajos intereses terrenales y lo lleva al dominio de los más altos y santos sentimientos vivos.



### SACRAMENTAL MINISTRY

#### BAPTISMS:

#### RECONCILIATION:

Confessions are heard on Saturdays from 3:00 – 3:45 p.m. (Little Church) and by appointment. Parish Reconciliation Services are held during Advent and Lent.

#### MARRIAGE:

Couples planning to be married should contact a priest or deacon at least six months before the anticipated date. All engaged couples must take a Marriage Preparation Course. Do not set a date until you have met with the priest or deacon.

#### COMMUNION TO THE SICK:



### STAND / Shield the Vulnerable

All volunteers (ages 18 or older) for the school and parish will need to complete the STAND process before beginning their volunteer service. This process is now online through *Shield the Vulnerable* – a compliance management system that will allow all parishes and schools to facilitate compliance with archdiocesan child protection requirements for all volunteers who work with minors, employees, and clergy. Step-by-step instructions are available on the parish website at: <http://www.shgparish.org/stand.aspx>. Many have asked how long it takes to be STAND approved. There is a minimum processing time of 3-4 weeks for all new volunteers and 2-3 weeks for volunteers seeking renewal.
