El Carácter de Dios

Relatando Su misión terrenal, Jesús dijo: El Padre "Me ungió para predicar el evangelio a los pobres. Me ha enviado a sanar a los quebrantados de corazón; a proclamar liberación a los cautivos, y recuperación de la vista a los ciegos; a poner en libertad a los oprimidos." Lucas 4:18. Esta era Su obra. Anduvo haciendo el bien y sanando a todos los oprimidos de Satanás. Había aldeas enteras donde no se oía un gemido de dolor en casa alguna, porque Él había pasado por ellas y sanado a todos sus enfermos. Su obra demostraba Su unción divina. En cada acto de Su vida revelaba amor, misericordia y compasión. Su corazón rebosaba de tierna simpatía por los hijos de los hombres. Se revistió de la naturaleza del hombre para poder simpatizar con sus necesidades. Los más pobres y humildes no tenían temor de acercársele. Aún los niñitos se sentían atraídos hacia Él. Les gustaba subir a Sus rodillas y contemplar Su rostro pensativo que irradiaba benignidad y amor.

Jesús no suprimió una palabra de verdad, pero siempre la expresó con amor. Hablaba con el mayor tacto, cuidado y misericordiosa atención. Nunca fue áspero ni pronunció innecesariamente una palabra severa, ni ocasionó a un alma sensible una pena innecesaria. No condenaba la debilidad humana. Decía la verdad, pero siempre con amor. Denunciaba la hipocresía, la incredulidad y la iniquidad; pero las lágrimas velaban Su voz cuando profería Sus fuertes repreciones. Lloró por Jerusalén, la ciudad amada, que rehusó recibirle a Él, que era el Camino, la Verdad y la Vida. Sus habitantes habían rechazado al Salvador, pero Él los consideraba con mucha ternura. Su

vida fue una vida de abnegación y solicitud por los demás. Toda alma era preciosa a Sus ojos. A la vez que se condujo siempre con dignidad divina, se inclinaba con la más tierna consideración sobre cada uno de los miembros de la familia de Dios. En todos los hombres veía almas caídas a quienes era Su misión salvar.

Tal es el carácter de Cristo según fue revelado en Su vida. Este es el carácter de Dios. Del corazón del Padre brotan para todos los hijos de los hombres los ríos de la compasión divina demostrada por Cristo. Jesús, el tierno y piadoso Salvador, era Dios "manifestado en carne." 1 Timoteo 3:16.

STAND

This process is now online a compliance management system that will allow all parishes and schools to facilitate compliance with archdiocesan child protection requirements for all volunteers who work with minors, employees, and clergy. There is a minimum processing time of 3-4 weeks for all new volunteers and 2-3 weeks for volunteers seeking renewal.
